We warmly welcome you to St Matthew's School. We are proud of the fact that ours is a warm and welcoming school.



Students come to St Matthew's from surrounding suburbs of Cornubia, Shailer Park, Carbrook, Loganholme and Tanah Merah. Most attend local early child care centres.



RELIGIOUS LIFE OF ST MATTHEW'S

St Matthew was chosen as patron of our school by Fr Bill O'Shea. In Matthew's gospel, Jesus is portrayed as the great teacher. Matthew's gospel includes many important teachings including The Sermon on the Mount. For Father Bill O'Shea, Matthew's Gospel was an excellent source of inspiration for a Catholic school community. Matthew's community was a community of master storytellers. At St Matthew's, we are a community of storytellers writing the ongoing story of God's kingdom. The name Matthew (Mattityahu) means "Gift of God." Each person in our community is a gift of God, created in the image and likeness of God, and part of the ongoing story of the Kingdom of God.

The Sisters of St Joseph were invited to set up St Matthew's School. Their founder, St Mary of the Cross MacKillop, founded her order so that all children could have the opportunity to receive a holistic Catholic education, rich in Faith, Knowledge and Love. We continue the St Mary MacKillop and Sisters of St Joseph story today.



OUR CATHOLIC IDENTITY

A Strong Catholic Identity at St Matthew's is formed through a planned and intentional Religious Life including, Religious Identity and Culture, Evangelisation, and Faith Formation, Prayer and Worship and Social Justice and Action.

Education at St Matthew's: The schools and colleges of the Archdiocese of Brisbane aspire to educate and form students who are challenged to live the gospel of Jesus Christ and who are literate in the Catholic and broader Christian tradition so that they might participate critically and authentically in faith contexts and wider society.

(Catholic Education Archdiocese of Brisbane, 2013, p. 10).

Within the context of the Catholic School, the purpose of Religious Education is to teach students about the Catholic religion and to teach them to be religious. Through the Religious Education Program, students are offered access to a faith tradition that is rich and life-giving. The development of the child's spirituality is central to our mission. The School and Parish work together to foster the Parish Sacramental Program.

The Religion Curriculum: St Matthew's School shares and promotes the Vision for Religious Education articulated by Brisbane Catholic Education and the wider church, to teach students about the Catholic religion and to teach them to be religious in the Catholic faith tradition. Through the Religious Education Curriculum, students are offered access to faith development that is rich and life-giving. Nurturing spirituality is central to our mission and the School and Parish work together with families to grow in faith, learning and peace. The Religious Education Curriculum is treated as a learning area just as English, Maths and Science are. Student work is assessed and reported on just as other subjects of the curriculum.

Learning in Religious Education

RE units are designed as a learning inquiry, where students respond to an overarching fertile question. Students are encouraged to be critical in their learning journey, to investigate, create and communicate their learning and personal understandings. The content in the Religion curriculum is divided into four strands that are taught in an integrated way. These are: Sacred Texts, Beliefs, Church and Christian Life.


Faith is celebrated and shared through the Religious Life of the School. Students, staff and families have regular opportunities to gather for prayer. Each class participates in daily prayer and we gather as a whole school community to begin school assembly with prayer. Students are exposed to a variety of prayer experiences, including being taught traditional prayers as part of their Year Level Religion Curriculum. In partnership with our Parish, we gather regularly for mass as a class or whole school to celebrate in the church. All families are invited to join in these moments of prayer. Preparation for students to receive the Sacraments of Initiation is co-ordinated by the parish and students are supported in their preparation by the school



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At St Matthew's, an engaged student den enstrates interest. attention, curiosity, passion, innovation, and optimism when they are learning or being taught. This extends to the level of motivation they have towards their learning and the progress they make in their education.

Engaged students manage their own learning and work to achieve goals that are important to them. They should believe that they can learn and know how to deal with failures. Students who are engaged and motivated will learn from educational experiences, incorporate problem-solving strategies, as well as seek and act upon constructive feedback when setbacks occur. At St Matthew's, we strive to be faithful by remaining loyal and steadfast to the teachings of Jesus.



The St Matthew's learning avocado is a structure that helps students know the what (learning intentions) and the why of their learning. It outlines the how (strategies) and the targets (success criteria) that they need to aim for to be succesful at their learning. They also use this to chart to know how to bump up their work! Learning is visible and in the hands of the students. Student learning videos are published regurlarly so you can hear what the students are learning. Class blogs and Seesaw accounts also allow you to get an insight into children's learning.

St Matthew's classrooms are welcoming places, where your child will be provided with a wide variety of rich tasks which meet curriculum expectations and through which they can also reach their true potential.

Each week, families will receive an email which outlines the learning and teaching that your child will work through. As you walk around our school you will now see all our learning intentions and success criteria on display within our classrooms. These are referred to on a regular basis during learning and teaching sequences. These learning intentions have been developed using Australian Curriculum standards. St Matthew's key messages about learners and learning and teachers and teaching are informed by our Christian Catholic traditions and the Brisbane Catholic Education Learning Framework. 
Teachers participate in regular planning sessions during which they focus on the provision of challenging and stimulating learning experiences and opportunities that enable all students to explore and build on their talents.

LEARNING AND TEACHING AT ST MATTHEW'S

Students, Learning and Pedagogy (the art of teaching)

Differentiation: Differentiation of teaching and assessment is about ensuring that every student is catered for and can learn in a way that meets his or her individual needs and abilities. At St Matthew's, all students are given opportunities to learn which are challenging, stimulating and achievable.

Engagement and Wellbeing: The best learning happens when students can be themselves, feel good about who they are and are interested in what they are learning. Student wellbeing is essential for happy, successful learners.

Contemporary Teaching Practices: 21st century classrooms need 21st Century teaching practices as well as modern technologies. All students have access to either laptops or iPads to support their learning. An integral part of ensuring quality pedagogy is the provision of regular and targeted professional learning for teachers.

Improving Literacy and Numeracy: Improving Literacy and Numeracy for every student at St Matthew's is a key priority. To identify and address specific areas of need in student learning, we collate and access reliable data, and use this to plan targetted learning activities and support when needed. Catholic Perspectives: We live our Catholic Identity by embedding Catholic Perspectives through the curriculum. We want students to be motivated and engaged to ask questions about faith and develop a relationship with God. By embracing the values of Jesus, students can develop a deeper understanding of themselves and relationships with others and creation.

approach to learning, based around inquiry and problembased learning, where real life problems drive the learning experiences and challenges is fostered and supported within the classroom. Year levels along with their teachers will work with a STEM support teacher to learn how to engage in these learning opportunities. We aim to foster a growth mindset where students are curious when plans don't go to plan and are able to be analytical in determining adjustments that are required to be more successful. The learning in these sessions are aimed to develop students' abilities, enabling them to be have the skills required for future jobs yet to be created.











STEM Enrichment Classes

These small classes cater to students who require a different type of learning challenge. Within these classes students are challenged to develop critical thinking skills required to solve problems. They are asked to apply their high levels of mathematical, science and technology knowledge along with their strengths in communication to various challenges. The process of design thinking is followed to allow students to analyse their processes and solutions while learning from previous attempts. Working collaboratively with peers is encouraged, along with freedom to select appropriate programs and materials to meet the needs of their given challenge. Entering competitions that showcase their abilities and enable participation in a larger community of like minded people is also a goal of these classes.

LEARNING AND TEACHING AT ST MATTHEW'S

LEARNING SUPPORT PROGRAM

The St Matthew's Student Support Network consists of:

- Support Teacher Inclusive Education (STIE): Supporting all students to achieve their potential in the learning environment and to plan and cater for students with disabilities in an inclusive community
- Guidance Counsellor
- Primary Learning Leader: Supports the implementation of curriculum programs and pedagogy, and student progress
- IT and Student Wellbeing and Engagement Staff: Supporting student social and emotional needs and Technology implemntaion
- · Learning Engagement Teacher: Supporting teachers in the implementaion of targetted learning practices

The Support Teacher Inclusive Education (STIE) hours are allocated each year by Brisbane Catholic Education according to school enrolment numbers. The ST-IE works in partnership with the class teacher, parents/caregivers, the leadership team and other associated professionals to plan for students with learning differences in order to maximise their access to the curriculum and to ensure the best possible outcomes for each student. Parents play an important role in this partnership and cooperation; communication and collaboration are all essential for successful outcomes for our students.

Parents/caregivers may be:

- invited to attend 'wrap around' meetings to address issues in relation to their child.
- invited to attend parent/teacher interviews with the class teacher and the STIE.
- invited to drop in for an informal chat with regards to their child.
- sent a letter outlining planned intervention for their child.
- referred to outside agencies for help in managing their child's difficulties.

School officers support teachers and students in clasroom and run a variety of learning interventions programs with students.



The School Guidance Counsellor (GC) delivers a broad range of services to the school community. These include comprehensive student support and wellbeing programs. The GC may work directly with students in addition to working with a student's teacher, school support personnel, family, other specialists or external support providers. Support offered includes providing advice and counselling on educational, behavioural, vocational, personal, social, family, and mental health and wellbeing issues, as well as responding to student protection matters, critical incidents, mental health issues, and suicide prevention and postvention support.



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WELCOME TO ST MATTHEW'S

What is Positive Behaviour for Learning?

PB4L is a framework for schools that uses a system approach to positive behaviour supports for all students. The aim of implementing the framework is to achieve increased academic and social progress and achievement for all students by using evidence-based practices. One of the focus areas is explicit teaching of behaviours that assists students to access learning - academically and socially - at all stages of development throughout their education. At St Matthew's our goal is for all students to be engaged and motivated learners. The aim is for a holistic approach where we treat all with kindness, dignity and respect. We recognise that our students come to school with a broad range of life experiences and needs. These may at times impact on their ability to engage in learning and to interact positively with those around them. It is the responsibility of all adults in the school to help children learn skills which enhance the wellbeing of themselves and others. PB4Learning is about people, practices and processes – it is not a program, but the way we work.

The following beliefs reflect current literature in positive behaviour supports:


- Schools play a vital role in promoting the intellectual, physical, social, emotional, moral and spiritual and aesthetic development and wellbeing of young Australians (Melbourne Declaration).
- Every day at school, students have the opportunity to learn and practice social skills and develop General Capabilities through the curriculum (ACARA).
- Behaviour is learned, therefore responsible behaviour can be taught.
- Student discipline is best achieved through instruction rather than punishment.
- Student behaviour can be taught with the same strategies used in learning and teaching academic skills.
- Misbehaviour presents the student with an opportunity to learn, the educator with an opportunity to teach.
- For behaviour change to occur, we must use positive approaches that strengthen teacher-student-parent relationships.
- Student discipline is a collaborative effort. In partnership with parents and carers, we are committed to the success of each and every student.
- Efforts to support all students to become successful learners, confident and creative individuals and active and informed citizens require ongoing teaching, encouragement and correction.
- Students need and want high standards for their behaviour. Maintaining high expectations does not require "get tough" or punitive approaches.
- An integrated system of school wide, classroom support and individual student supports can play a central role in improving behavioural outcomes and developing learning disposition for the students we serve.
- This system also has the potential to contribute to an increased sense of efficacy and job satisfaction for our staff.
- Services for students with chronic or intense behaviours are more effective within the context of school-wide commitment to the social and academic development of all students.

Our Expectations: School-wide expectations encourage consistent communications and establish a common language of expectations for all staff and students and across all settings. Agreed upon student expectations promote the school's Catholic Identity and provide consistency across the staff and school community. Our expectations are: • Faith • Knowledge • Love

Our school-wide matrix determines the social skills and behaviours we expect all students and staff to learn, practice and demonstrate. They allow us to teach proactively and to provide students and parents with a positive message about behaviours for learning at school. At St Matthew's, all classes develop a Class Covenant at the beginning of each year, formulated and agreed upon by teacher and students. The covenant is based upon school wide expectations, with an emphasis on fostering positive relationships using restorative justice principles. $\overline{\circ}$

Encouraging Productive Behaviours for Learning

Feedback and encouragement strategies happen at a class, year and whole school level. They include merit awards, celebrating learning and various award systems.

Responding to unproductive behaviours

At times students will require some reteaching of expected behaviours. This may be led by class teachers, student support staff or leadership. Some students may require intensive support in this area. Data informed procesess are put in place with either de escalation, problem solving and/or restorative strategies applied. Partnership with parents in supporting children with behaviour responses is an important part of the process. At times more formal sanctions including detention and suspension may be used.



Bullying

Bullying is:

- A repetitive attack which causes distress not only at the time of the attack but also by the threat of future attacks
- It is characterised by an imbalance of power
- It can be verbal / physical / social / psychological / sexual If your child is worried about bullying we ask them to report to a teacher or trusted adult. If children require support to do this please be in contact with your class teacher. Bystanders are asked to intervene if safe and tell a teacher. As adults we hold an objective safe space and ask parents to work with the school in finding solutions, supporting all students and reinforcing strategies. The school will work with all students and families impacted in the situation. Restorative processes will be employed.

Student Behaviour Online

Our School ICT Acceptable Use Agreement provides guidelines around online behaviour and acceptable use of ICTs. We work with students and families to discuss responsible use of technology and the treatment of others online. Inappropriate use of technology and devices, or instances of cyberbullying or harassment, may result in device access restrictions or further formal behaviour sanctions. Parents are encouraged to contact the school if there are any situations online that raise concerns.

All classrooms are airconditioned and have modern educational furnishings that support different learning styles. Prep has it's own designated precinct.



The SCHOOL LIBRARY aims to be a vital part of the school's teaching and learning program by providing an up-to date and well-balanced collection of resources that reflect the school's teaching and learning program facilitating cooperative planning and teaching between the Teacher-Librarian and classroom teachers, so resources are used effectively. Each class has a weekly library session with the Teacher-Librarian (T-L). Students complete literature and research skills planned cooperatively by the T-L and class teacher to compliment or extend current classroom units of work.


FACE Family and Community
